Donald Dewees is a Professor Emeritus of Economics and of Law at the University of Toronto. He holds an engineering degree from Swarthmore College, an LLB from Harvard and a PhD in Economics from Harvard. He served as Director of Research for the Ontario Royal Commission on Asbestos and Vice-Chair of the Ontario Market Design Committee, which advised the government on the introduction of competition into the electricity market.

His research is in the areas of environmental economics including emissions trading, law and economics, and energy policy including electricity pricing, the environmental effects of electricity generation, electricity prices and renewable power, and consumer response to prices and incentives.
