#### What is an Emergency Response Unit?

"An Emergency Response Unit (ERU) is a standardized modular package of highly qualified and trained personnel and equipment ready to be deployed to international emergencies at short notice."



#### MAIN FEATURES OF AN ERU



- ✓ Rapid Response Global Tool / Can be deployed within 24-48 hours
- ✓ Modular capacity based on the needs
- ✓ Deployed with a core number of trained staff
- ✓ Self-sustaining for at least one month in disaster affected areas (only needs: water source, fuel supply and HR)
- ✓ Deployed after rapid field assessment
- ✓Part of an integrated and coordinated global response system
- ✓ Can serve a population of up to 50,000 persons

#### ✓ ERUs are owned by Red Cross **National Societies throughout** the world

 Based on the needs, the following modules can be



- Optional lab and X-ray





## THE FIELD HOSPITAL = ENHANCED RESPONSIVENESS TO DISASTERS:


- Deployable anywhere in the world within 48 hours
- Able to start providing health care services within 12 hours of arrival
- Can treat up to 300 patients a day when fully operational
- Can operate for up to 4 months



### HOW TO PREPARE FOR AN ERU DEPLOYMENT?

- Packaging, colour-coding and labelling of modules at warehouse
- Selection of warehouse close to Toronto airport
- Maintenance of packing lists
- Expiry date management
- Field testing of equipment
- Close collaboration with suppliers

## WHO OPERATES A FIELD HOSPITAL?

In order to operate a Health ERU, the Canadian Red Cross maintains a roster composed of the following profiles:

- Nurses (Ward, Operating Theater, Emergency, Outpatient/Emergency)
- Doctors (General Practitioners, Surgeons, Anaesthetists, Emergency, Paediatrician, Obstetrics)
- Midwives
- X-Ray and Laboratory Technicians
- Psychosocial Professionals
- Administrators/Manager (Finance, HR, Logistics)
- Technicians (Electrical, Water and Sanitation, IT/Telecom, Shelter, General Trades)




