





PURPOSE

Lighter-than-air transport is ready to take its place in the world of logistics. Two large airships are scheduled for delivery to the US armed forces in December 2011. Civilian versions of these military aircraft are expected to follow that can lift 10 to 50 tons and operate with minimal ground support. This conference will examine how cargo airships will be a game changer for transportation. Shippers and suppliers will come together to assess the supply and demand potential for the use of airships in frontier logistics, including Alaska and Northern Canada.
